Race Details:

The Mainpeak Paddlesports Summer Dash is a race for those who want a fun challenge or for the serious paddlers out there.

The event is organised by Canoeing WA in conjunction with major sponsors and will run on the 4th February 2007.

Starting at Point Walter.

The long course will start from the jetty at the base of the Pt Walter sand bar. Paddlers will travel around the sand bar and head down stream via a marker adjacent to the rock wall of Blackwall Reach. Competitors round two markers in front of East Fremantle Yacht Club and then paddle back upstream along Blackwall Reach on the Mosman Park side, rounding Chidley Pt. From Chidley Pt competitors must paddle around a marker adjacent to Swan Canoe Club then take the shortest line to Claremont Bay where they will be required to round two markers near Claremont Yacht Club. The course then takes the shortest line to the Pt Resolution marker near Dalkeith before crossing the channel to finish back at Pt Walter .

The short course event will follow the same line as the Long course until the first EFYC marker. At this point short course paddlers will do a U-turn and return to Pt Walter the way they came. All participants who complete the short course will receive a Summer Dash T-Shirt and be eligible for several novelty prize categories.

Race Rules:

The organisers reserve the right to reject or cancel any entrant at any time.

Entry fee is non-refundable.

The judge's decision is final.

If conditions are considered unsafe an alternate course will be set.

If no alternate course is available the race can be cancelled and Canoeing WA accepts no financial responsibility.

Canoeing WA, its sponsors, officials take no liability for any injury, loss or damage to any participant or craft.

Competitors participate in the event at their own risk.

Dash for Cash rules posted on website

Canoeing WA strongly recommends that a buoyancy vest be worn

Conditions of Entry:

1. Competitors must obey directives from Race Referee, Official craft, Water Police and any Local Council Rangers otherwise face disqualification.
2. Paddle craft must give way to commercial and pleasure craft using the river.
3. Rules and regulations of Canoeing WA will be enforced when required.
4. All protests must be written and accompanied by a \$50 fee. This will not be refunded if protest is unsuccessful.
5. All protests must be received within 5min of last craft finishing.
6. Prizes will only be awarded to those classes with 5 or more craft in them
